An institutional environment that is proactive in creating spaces where students feel safe and free to pursue their education is imperative. More than ever college campuses in the United States are grappling with how to best do this in the midst of protests, uncivil discourse, and deep political divide. Balancing the needs of a wide spectrum of students is increasingly more complex. Understanding students' perceptions and experiences can begin to explain how to unpack this paradox.
